Pottering with Poppy

Poppy and I had a lovely walk this morning. There is no sun, no hint of blue sky but it is quiet there is no breeze and the only noises were distant ones. The train on the Halesworth line, a lorry some way off, all made more distant by the atmosphere. A classic autumn morning of mistiness, moisture and changing colours. It reminds me of childhood rhymes.

The damp has created pearly drops of moisture on the leaves of the trees, and there is the occasional plop as they get too heavy and fall to the leaf strewn floor of Vicarage Grove. There are jays collecting and stashing acorns. Their chatter is probably them arguing as to whose wood it is to gather acorns in.

Out into the light of Grove Piece and the atmosphere changes. The spiders have been weaving their webs between the grasses and the Bristly Ox Tongue. The small guelder rose trees that have been planted here have turned gorgeous colours of red and orange. Along with all the other plenty that is evident in the hedge rows I think it is already a really good autumn for fungi. They are erupting like little volcanoes from the woodland floor and there are others out in the open fields and hedgerows. There is a part ring of beautiful fresh Parass this morning, standing tall, some with large open caps others still conical that will gradually open and spread and all with their distinctive shaggy collar. There are many other types, some

shiny with moisture, some battered and broken, easily damaged by footfall of animals and humans. Their visible existence is short lived. What we see as mushrooms and toadstools are the fruiting bodies of a maze of underground fibres, that, given the right time and conditions,

pop up to show themselves in all their amazing variety. Meanwhile, Poppy is as ever hoovering up the overnight messages left by the passing creatures of the night and early morning. **Jo Small**


If anyone has any other fundraising ideas, or would like to make a donation in their will, please contact us .
